1st Reading - Job 42.1-6, 10-17

¹ Then Job answered the Lord : ² 'I know that you can do all things, and that no purpose of yours can be thwarted.

³ "Who is this that hides counsel without knowledge?" Therefore I have uttered what I did not understand, things too wonderful for me, which I did not know. ⁴ "Hear, and I will speak; I will question you, and you declare to me." ⁵ I had heard of you by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees you; ⁶ therefore I despise myself, and repent in dust and ashes.'

¹⁰ And the Lord restored the fortunes of Job when he had prayed for his friends; and the Lord gave Job twice as much as he had before.

¹¹ Then there came to him all his brothers and sisters and all who had known him before, and they ate bread with him in his house; they showed him sympathy and comforted him for all the evil that the Lord had brought upon him; and each of them gave him a piece of money and a gold ring.

¹² The Lord blessed the latter days of Job more than his beginning; and he had fourteen thousand sheep, six thousand camels, a thousand yoke of oxen, and a thousand donkeys.

¹³ He also had seven sons and three daughters.

¹⁴ He named the first Jemimah, the second Keziah, and the third Keren-happuch.

¹⁵ In all the land there were no women so beautiful as Job's daughters; and their father gave them an inheritance along with their brothers.

¹⁶ After this Job lived for one hundred and forty years, and saw his children, and his children's children, four generations.

¹⁷ And Job died, old and full of days.

Hear the word of the Lord, **thanks be to God.**

Psalm 34.1-8

¹ I will bless the Lord continually: **his praise shall be always in my mouth.**

² Let my soul boast of the Lord: **the humble shall hear it and rejoice.**

³ O praise the Lord with me: **let us exalt his name together.**

⁴ For I sought the Lord's help and he answered: **and he freed me from all my fears.**

⁵ Look towards him and be bright with joy: **your faces shall not be ashamed.**

⁶ Here is a wretch who cried, and the Lord heard me: **and saved me from all my troubles.**

⁷ The angel of the Lord encamps round those who fear him: **and delivers them in their need.**

⁸ O taste and see that the Lord is good: **happy are they that hide in him!**

2nd Reading – Hebrews 7.21-28

²¹ but this one became a priest with an oath, because of the one who said to him,

'The Lord has sworn

and will not change his mind,

"You are a priest for ever" '—

²² accordingly Jesus has also become the guarantee of a better covenant.

²³ Furthermore, the former priests were many in number, because they were prevented by death from continuing in office;

²⁴ but he holds his priesthood permanently, because he continues for ever.

²⁵ Consequently he is able for all time to save those who approach God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them.

²⁶ For it was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, undefiled, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens.

²⁷ Unlike the other high priests, he has no need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for those of the people; this he did once for all when he offered himself.

²⁸ For the law appoints as high priests those who are subject to weakness, but the word of the oath, which came later than the law, appoints a Son who has been made perfect for ever.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark 10.46-52, Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

⁴⁶ They came to Jericho. As he and his disciples and a large crowd were leaving Jericho, Bartimaeus son of Timaeus, a blind beggar, was sitting by the roadside. ⁴⁷ When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout out and say, 'Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!' ⁴⁸ Many sternly ordered him to be quiet, but he cried out even more loudly, 'Son of David, have mercy on me!' ⁴⁹ Jesus stood still and said, 'Call him here.' And they called the blind man, saying to him, 'Take heart; get up, he is calling you.' ⁵⁰ So throwing off his cloak, he sprang up and came to Jesus. ⁵¹ Then Jesus said to him, 'What do you want me to do for you?' The blind man said to him, 'My teacher, let me see again.' ⁵² Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has made you well.'

Immediately he regained his sight and followed him on the way.
