1st Reading - Hosea 11.1-11

¹ When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called my son. ² The more I called them, the more they went from me; they kept sacrificing to the Baals, and offering incense to idols. ³ Yet it was I who taught Ephraim to walk, I took them up in my arms; but they did not know that I healed them. ⁴ I led them with cords of human kindness, with bands of love. I was to them like those who lift infants to their cheeks. I bent down to them and fed them. ⁵ They shall return to the land of Egypt, and Assyria shall be their king, because they have refused to return to me. ⁶ The sword rages in their cities, it consumes their oracle-priests, and devours because of their schemes. ⁷ My people are bent on turning away from me. To the Most High they call, but he does not raise them up at all. ⁸ How can I give you up, Ephraim? How can I hand you over, O Israel? How can I make you like Admah? How can I treat you like Zeboiim? My heart recoils within me; my compassion grows warm and tender. ⁹ I will not execute my fierce anger; I will not again destroy Ephraim; for I am God and no mortal, the Holy One in your midst, and I will not come in wrath. ¹⁰ They shall go after the Lord, who roars like a lion; when he roars, his children shall come trembling from the west. ¹¹ They shall come trembling like birds from Egypt, and like doves from the land of Assyria; and I will return them to their homes, says the Lord.

Hear the word of the Lord, thanks be to God.

Psalm 107.1-9, 43

107

- ¹ O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good: for his loving mercy is for ever.
- ² Let the Lord's redeemed say so: whom he has redeemed from the hand of the enemy,
- ³ And gathered in from every land, from the east and from the west: from the north and from the south.
- ⁴ Some went astray in the wilderness and in the desert: and found no path to an inhabited city;
- ⁵ They were hungry and thirsty: and their heart fainted within them.
- ⁶ Then they cried to the Lord in their distress: and he took them out of their trouble.
- ⁷ He led them by the right path: **till they came to an inhabited city.**
- ⁸ Let them thank the Lord for his goodness: and for the wonders that he does for the children of Adam;
- ⁹ For he satisfies the thirsty: and fills the hungry with good things.

- ¹ Give judgement for me, O God, take up my cause against an ungodly people: deliver me from the deceitful and unjust.
- ² For you are God my refuge—why have you turned me away: **why must I go like a mourner because the enemy oppresses me?**
- ³ O send out your light and your truth, and let them lead me: let them guide me to your holy hill and to your dwelling.
- ⁴ Then I shall go to the altar of God, to God my joy and my delight: and to the harp I shall sing your praises, O God, my God.
- ⁵ Why are you so full of heaviness, my soul: and why so unquiet within me?
- ⁶ O put your trust in God: for I will praise him yet, who is my deliverer and my God.

2nd Reading – Colossians 3.1-11

Hear the word of the Lord, thanks be to God.

¹ So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ² Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, ³ for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴ When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory. ⁵ Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). ⁶ On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. ⁷ These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. ⁸ But now you must get rid of all such things—anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. ⁹ Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices ¹⁰ and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. ¹¹ In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke 12.13-21, Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

¹³ Someone in the crowd said to him, 'Teacher, tell my brother to divide the family inheritance with me.' ¹⁴ But he said to him, 'Friend, who set me to be a judge or arbitrator over you?' ¹⁵ And he said to them, 'Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions.' ¹⁶ Then he told them a parable: 'The land of a rich man produced abundantly. ¹⁷ And he thought to himself, "What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops?" ¹⁸ Then he said, "I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. ¹⁹ And I will say to my soul, Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry." ²⁰ But God said to him, "You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?" ²¹ So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich towards God.' For the Gospel of the Lord, **Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ**
